

EVENT-IN-A-BOX

The restrictions caused by the COVID-19 pandemic did not stop the Balding for Dollars community in their fundraising efforts. In 2021, the team decided if people couldn't come to a party, they would bring the party to them. Sending out 25 curated boxes, filled with t-shirts, balloons, mini banners, and popcorn, the team brought the fun and celebration of Balding for Dollars events into people's homes. Through the creativity of people in their homes, and the generosity of people across BC, more than \$40,000 was raised. Thank you!

Balding for Dollars also held a virtual auction & 50/50 draw which raised over \$11,000 for a total of more than \$51,000.

Return of the in-person main event!

After two years of virtual events, Balding for Dollars was able to host its much-missed Main Event in-person. Held at Congregation Beth Israel, a synagogue in Vancouver, the event was filled with music, head shaves, games and food, and raised more than \$82,000.

A MIGHTY COMMUNITY

Over the last two years, people from across BC have come together to raise money for pediatric cancer research through Balding for Dollars. We're happy to share some stories that highlight the energy, creativity and generosity of this wonderful community.

Jayden's Run

In 2021, the Balding for Dollars team received an email from Jayden, a former BC Children's oncology patient. Jayden had a plan to run 107 km from his home in Chilliwack to BC Children's—the equivalent distance of two and a half marathons. "Whenever I am having a bad day, or I'm upset about something, I look back and think of those difficult times and tell myself to start focusing on how great I truly have it," Jayden wrote in his email. "There are kids in the hospital right now, thinking those same thoughts, and that's what this run is about."

The Balding for Dollars team set out to support Jayden and cheer him on. Respecting COVID-19 restrictions, they gathered a small group outside of the hospital, with family and friends, ready to cheer at the finish line. The atmosphere was electric with cheers, tears, and so much pride as Jayden ran through the balloon arch that marked 107 km. Jayden raised over \$125,000, which supported three oncology initiatives at BC Children's, including \$40,000 in support of Balding for Dollars.

"Ever since I got cancer in 2015, I always wanted to do something to give back to BC Children's Hospital, and with the support of each and every one of you, we did much more than that," said Jayden after the run. "Yeah, we raised a lot of money; yeah, we ran a long distance, but what was best of all was we got to give hope to kids at BC Children's—hope that things really do get better and hope that if you set your mind to it, you really can do anything and make a difference in this world."

CELEBRATING 24 YEARS OF BALDING FOR DOLLARS

How did Balding for Dollars begin? Marissa Dunbar, administrator of Balding for Dollars tells us how far the community has grown since the first Balding for Dollars event in 2000.

Balding for Dollars has been bringing people together and helping kids with cancers for 24 years. It began with Dan Warner and Kelly May who organized a one-day event to raise money. Kelly's daughter was a leukemia patient at BC Children's, and her brother was a firefighter, so the very first event was a group of firefighters raising funds by having their heads shaved. Over the next few years this expanded to include a hockey team, and more members of the public, until it grew into an enormous and energetic community.

Now, Balding for Dollars is a full organization, with a major event every year that attracts hundreds of people, and community events throughout BC. We also have a dedicated committee that helps direct how the incredible funds we raise can help kids and families at BC Children's—supporting research, care, bursary programs, practical support, and teen and family adventures.

It's amazing to look back and see how far we have come, and how through the generosity of people across BC, we're able to do so much for kids and their families. I am so grateful to everyone who has supported Balding for Dollars over the past 24 years!

HOW BALDING FOR DOLLARS HELPS

The difference Balding for Dollars is making can be felt at every step of a child's cancer journey. 
Teen Adventures

Kayaking, whale watching, ziplining, and horseback riding are only a few of the fun adventures teens have enjoyed thanks to Balding for Dollars. Teen Adventures is an outdoor program for youth aged 13-18 years old, who have been diagnosed with cancer or a blood disorder at BC Children's. These trips are kindly attended by health care and support teams to help ensure everyone is cared for as they enjoy their time in nature.

In 2022, teens were able to go whitewater rafting in Whistler. What better way to learn of their adventures than talking to one of the teens who was there?

"I'm Zoe and I went on the Whistler rafting trip this year. I just wanted to say thank you so much for giving me the opportunity to go. I really loved the more adventurous things we did like the Train Wreck hike, whitewater rafting and swimming at Porteau Cove. It was such a great experience to meet new people who've faced similar circumstances. After no more than an hour. I was friends with everyone! The nurses were so funny and always made sure there was never a dull moment on the

A kid's time at the hospital can be daunting, where people speak a-difficult-to-understand medical language, and rooms are filled with strange machines. They might be in hospital for weeks or months, missing their friends, family and home. Fortunately, at BC Children's, child life specialists are on hand for kids, to hear and understand their perspectives, and be there for them every step of the way.

Your generosity is helping to support child life specialists like Kristina Jackson, whose role at the division of oncology, hematology & blood and marrow transplant (BMT) is to give a voice to a child's needs, care for their comfort and mental well-being, and provide support to them and their families.

Balding for Dollars is able to give child life specialists art and baking supplies for therapeutic activities, craft materials, decorations and gifts for birthdays and holidays, information to help kids understand their diagnosis, and music therapy supplies to promote coping and self-expression through music. Patient and Family Practical Support

This is why Balding for Dollars offers a range of support for families at BC Children's, from laundry soap and beverages in the family lounge in the oncology, hematology, and Blood & Marrow Transplant area, to gift cards for coffee and meals and games and activities for kids.

The Balding for Dollars team also provides fun for families who are spending time at the hospital. Throughout the year the team handed out treat and craft gift bags to families.

December can be exceptionally tough, so Marissa decided to reach out for some donations to add to what could be offered to in-patient families over the holidays. They focused on the families and siblings of patients, giving practical gift cards, and activities that could provide comfort and holiday spirit. Twenty-seven bags, made possible by donors, friends, and small business sponsors, were provided to families who were overwhelmed with joy and gratitude.

Childhood Cancer Research

It is through ground-breaking research that children and their families are given renewed hope as they navigate their cancer journey. Because of the brilliance of oncology researchers, like those at the Michael Cuccione Childhood Cancer Research Program (MCCCRP) at BC Children's, the dedication of health care professionals, and the community of donors who support them, over 80 per cent of children now survive their cancers. BC Children's Hospital has the best childhood cancer survival rates in Canada. But there is still more to do. We want survival rates to reach 100 per cent.

Researchers at the MCCCRP are on a relentless pursuit to make childhood cancers a thing of the past. In their own words, they share how their work is helping transform the landscape of pediatric cancer treatments and their gratitude for your support in making this possible.

BURSARY PROGRAM

Balding for Dollars is remarkable in its offering of bursaries exclusively for cancer survivors and young people receiving treatment. This support helps give students access to post-secondary education.

In 2021, 15 bursaries were awarded, totaling \$19,970.44, and in 2022, 18 bursaries provided \$27,000 in education support. Thanks to Balding for Dollars, a new generation of students is advancing their education and building their skills to help others.

One example of the successes made possible through the bursary program is Madeline Lauener, who was awarded bursaries in 2021 and 2022. At 12 years old, Madeline was diagnosed with stage 4 non-Hodgkin's lymphoma and received treatment at BC Children's, including a stem cell transplant. Now, 23 years old and a cancer survivor, Madeline is studying stem cell transplants as a PhD student at the MCCCRP, focusing on developing new ways to make stem cell transplantations safer for patients. Madeline is deeply grateful for the community of donors that have allowed her to pursue her dreams to help others as she has been helped.


